### Updates from DC: What May Happen Next

- The House may resume negotiations on the American Health Care Act (AHCA), the measure that would repeal major parts of the Affordable Care Act (ACA) and make dramatic cuts to the Medicaid program.
- House Speaker Paul Ryan (R-WI) has indicated that the AHCA bill will not be brought to a vote in the House until enough votes are secured for it to pass.
- President Trump would like a deal in first 100 days by April 29.
- MacArthur Amendment to the American Health Care Act made more changes.

# Other Updates from the 115<sup>th</sup> Congress: What May Happen Next

#### Advice for Wisconsin Advocates

#### **Key Concerns Remain**

- Medicaid would be cut by \$839 billion over 10 years. The bill would radically restructure the entire Medicaid program by converting it to a per capita cap or block grant. These changes will force states to make decisions on who should be covered under state Medicaid programs, whether people have to wait for services, and what services and supports are included.
- States could choose not to cover Essential Health Benefits, effectively ending pre-existing conditions protections. Now most plans must cover key services, such as inpatient and outpatient care, prescription drugs, mental health treatment, substance abuse treatment, and maternity care.
- States could allow insurers to charge people higher premiums for health coverage based on their health which means insurers could once again discriminate based against people based on their medical history.

#### Estimates of Medicaid cuts to WI

 Congress has not received official per-state estimates of the impacts of cuts to Medicaid.

- The Urban Institute has calculated that the American Health Care Act as approved by the House Budget Committee would result in a \$1 billion cut over 10 years to Wisconsin Medicaid funds.

#### Congressional Budget Office Summary of AHCA (3/13/17)

- States would have to choose whether to add extra state money to fully support their Medicaid programs and services, or reduce spending by cutting payments to providers, eliminating optional services, restricting eligibility, or (if feasible) delivering services more efficiently
- CBO prediction: states would adopt a mix of these approaches, resulting in federal savings.



# Advocacy Strategy for Wisconsin House Members and U.S. Senators


- 1. Make a call this week: Remind them you are paying attention





GREEN BAY - I am an active member of my community, have a master's degree in social work, and am active in volunteer and advocacy activities.

I also depend on Medicaid for my health insurance and long-term supports funded by the IRIS program. These supports help me get out of bed in the

morning, get ready for my day, and prevent costly emergency medical care. I have lived in nursing homes when my care has not been good, and that's no place for a 28year-old.


I am extremely distraught by the proposed changes to Medicaid that would result in billions of dollars in cuts if the Republican-proposed American Health Care Act succeeds in replacing the Affordable Care Act. IRIS is so cost-effective and allows me the dignity and the cost savings of being in my own apartment instead of a facility. Yet I am having trouble getting through to my congressional representative by phone and now I find out there are no plans for public hearings on these massive changes.

Congress needs to hear real stories from real people like me. They need to look me in the eye when they talk about these cuts. Tax incentives and health savings accounts won't help me. I have ideas for cost savings, but there are no congressional town halls planned in my part of the state. We need to hold our members of Congress accountable when they make massive cuts on the backs of people with disabilities. low-income kids and frail elders
