## **Equal Access to Voting**

## What's Happening?

Many voters with disabilities have barriers to voting. These include polling place accessibility issues, limited access to transportation, lack of photo ID and health or disability related concerns that may limit their ability to vote. Some new bills could create more barriers and make it harder to vote.

### What Does it Mean?

- It can be hard for people with disabilities to vote.
- Voting is a constitutional right and people with disabilities should not be left out.
- Voters with disabilities are under-represented at the ballot box.
   For our democracy to work, it must include all of us.



Make your Call!

### What to Ask For?

- Support pro-voter policies that make our elections more accessible.
- Say no to bills that make it harder for people with disabilities to vote.
- Add ADA compliant screen readers to assure accessible absentee ballots.
- Provide funding to expand the Wisconsin Election Commission Polling Place Accessibility Audits and Accessibility Supplies programs.
- Require poll workers to complete training on disability rights and accommodations.
- Expand acceptable photo ID options.
- Fund transportation for voting related activities.
- Expand service hours at the Dept. of Motor Vehicle (DMV) locations and add mobile sites to improve access to photo ID so people with disabilities can exercise their right to vote.

## **Family Caregiving**

### What's Happening?

Wisconsin Family Caregivers need help.

### What Does it Mean?

- Family caregivers fill in the gaps when the service system fails—doing things like providing care management, transportation, direct care, employment support, education, and day service supports.
- Lots of family caregivers leave their jobs or have to cut work hours because there are no other options for care.
- Family caregivers need breaks. A lack of paid workers is making it impossible for families to take a break.
- Continual stress is damaging the physical and mental health of both family caregivers and the people they care for.
- Family caregivers are aging and many need supports and services themselves to remain at home.
- People who do not have family to help are not able to stay in their own homes and communities.

### What to Ask For?

- Support family caregiver tax credits.
- Educate WI employers on how to provide help to employees who are providing care to a family member.
- Increase respite funding throughout Wisconsin.
- Investigate how many hours of care are being provided by family members or are unfulfilled due to lack of paid service providers.
- Invest more money to expand flexible and reliable public transit and specialized transportation.
- Expand who can use Family and Medical Leave (FMLA) to include grandparents, grandchildren, and siblings.

## **Direct Care Workforce**

### What's Happening?

The current workforce shortage means people don't have the supports to stay safe and healthy in their homes.



### What Does it Mean?

- Wisconsin elders, kids, and adults with disabilities wait every day for services they need because there are no workers.
- People are being forced to move in to group homes and institutions to get the care they used to get at home.
- People are going without necessary supports like help preparing meals, getting out of bed and at work, affecting their health and safety.
- Caregivers are being stretched too thin, creating health and safety risks for themselves and those they care for.

## Make your Call!



### What to Ask For?

- Provide emergency funding for community based supports to keep people in their homes.
- Allow low-wage care workers to work and earn more pay without losing health care or childcare help.
- Direct the Dept. of Health Services (DHS) to include community direct care workers and advocates to have a voice in workforce initiatives.
- Direct the Dept. of Workforce
   Development (DWD) to include the community-based direct care
   workforce in its Fast Forward grants.
- Fund public schools to make sure they have the staff they need to support kids with disabilities.







Take away **Equal** voting **Access** to barriers for **Voting** people with disabilities.


